## Re: COSCO BC urges Canada to support the resolution on the human rights of older persons at the 58<sup>th</sup> session of the Human Rights Council (HCR)

The Council of Senior Citizens' Organizations of BC (COSCO BC) wishes to draw your attention to the <u>Human Rights Council (HRC)</u> of the United Nations (UN), which will hold its 58<sup>th</sup>session from 24<sup>th</sup> February to 4<sup>th</sup> April 2025 in Geneva. Ahead of the 58<sup>th</sup> session, we understand that the core group of Member States leading the work on the human rights of older persons at the HRC will present a draft procedural resolution for negotiation and possible adoption at the 58<sup>th</sup> session.

We understand this draft resolution will respond to the <u>General Assembly resolution</u> <u>78/324</u> that, among other things, urges relevant UN bodies, respecting the relevant mandate, to further consider the recommendations as adopted by the UN <u>Open-ended Working Group on Ageing</u> (OEWGA) in its <u>decision 14/1</u> (from para 28). We are expecting that the draft resolution will propose the creation of a new process to advance the dedicated discussions on the human rights of older persons by working on the content of a new international legally binding instrument.

COSCO BC supports the Canadian Coalition Against Ageism (CCAA) in that we want a strong resolution to be adopted by consensus which will be an essential next step forward in building on the rich evidence base compiled by the Office of the High Commissioner for Human Rights (OHCHR) and the OEWGA that States, civil society organizations, National Human Rights Institutions and other stakeholders have actively contributed to over 14 years. We should also build on the strong evidence gathered by OHCHR following the HRC resolutions <u>48/3</u> and <u>54/13</u>. It is vital that all the resources invested in this work are not wasted.

As a non-partisan voice for BC Seniors, we presented to the May 2024 meeting of the OEWGA in New York to highlight important gaps in the human rights of older persons which in our view can only be filled through developing the content of the instrument mentioned above.

We request that you support and participate in these negotiations. We would also welcome your vocal support for the full, meaningful and effective participation of older people and civil society in any new process that is created.
