

Continue to find ways to stay connected using technology






Connect in Creative Ways

Gluu Tip: Limit how often you share articles, links & jokes


- Host or participate in

Share Your Stories


- → Assemble photos for prints or an album
- → Scan photos and share
- → Send your photos and videos away for digitizing. Get help organizing them.
- Use Voice Memo apps to tell the story of a photo or video or memento
- Scan favourite family recipes. Tell the stories of your favourite recipes in a video or Voice Memo. Host a cooking video call.



Look Like a Pro

- → Know the difference between your Front Facing & Rear Facing cameras
- → Get a stand to hold your device so you can sit comfortably and talk
- → Face a light or window
- Look into the camera when you're talking, not the screen

- → Have fun!


